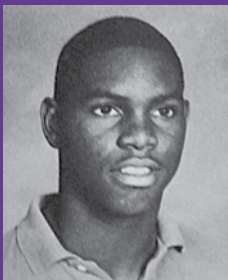


ALEX ORANGE MEMORIAL DEDICATION CEREMONY

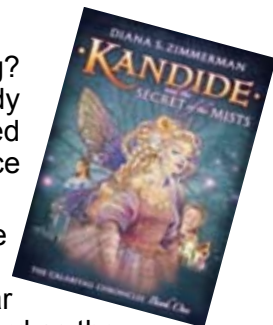


SAMPLE MOTIVATING SESSIONS!

Shawn's life spun out of control as his father first lost his career, then faced prison time, and, ultimately, took his own life. In this powerful presentation, Shawn shares the tragic events that transformed his "dream life" into a living nightmare and reflects on the central role service-learning played in helping him finally begin to move past his grief. Shawn not only inspires young people to involve themselves in service, he provides them with direction and advice on making that service successful and meaningful for all involved.

A Novel Approach to Stop Bullying. Can books change kids and help stop bullying? Best selling fantasy adventure author, corporate CEO, and former "World's Greatest Lady Magician," Diana S. Zimmerman, knows they can. You'll laugh, cry, and be simply amazed as she unmask the magical secrets she uses to help to increase self-esteem and reduce bullying.
