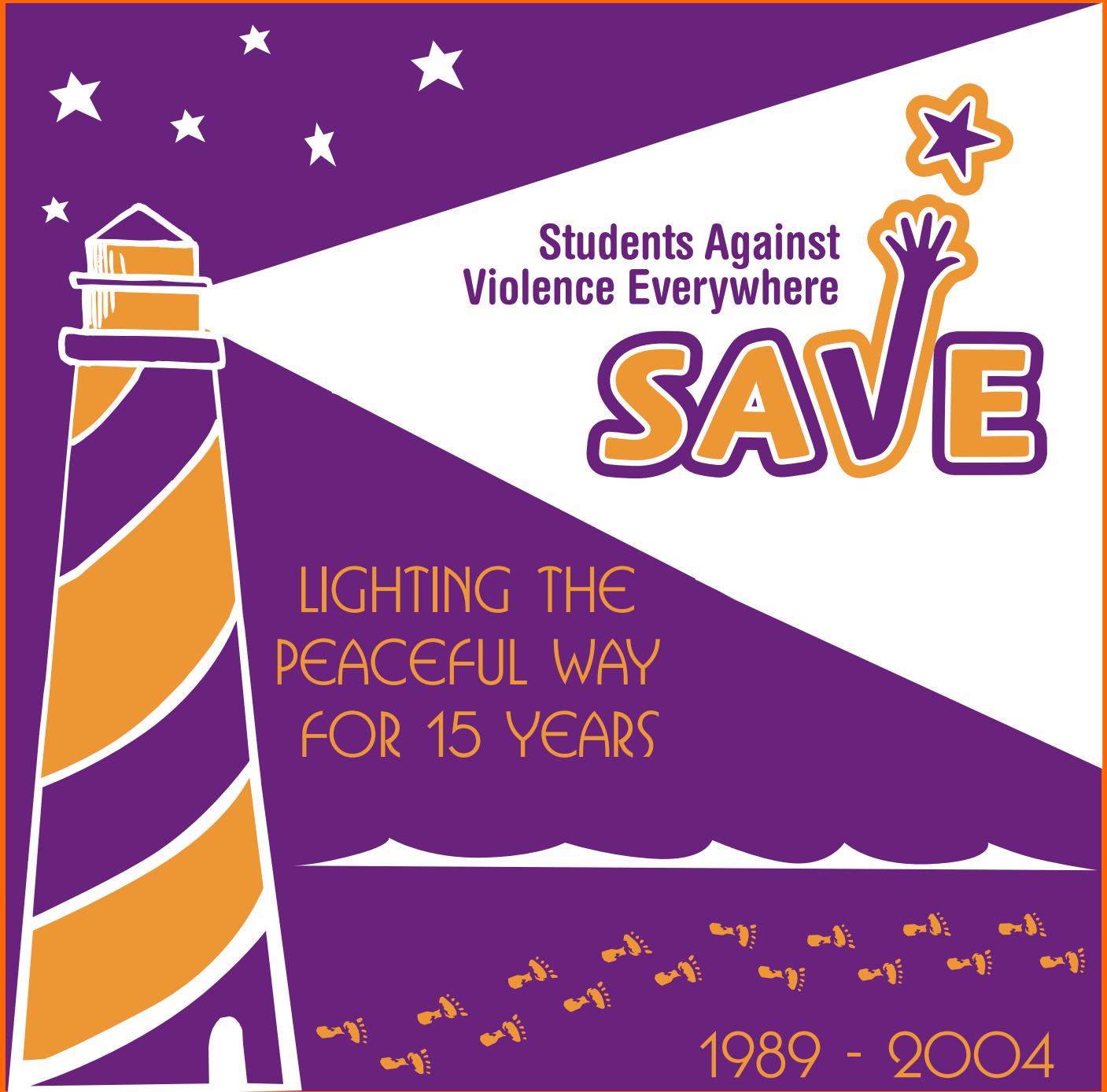

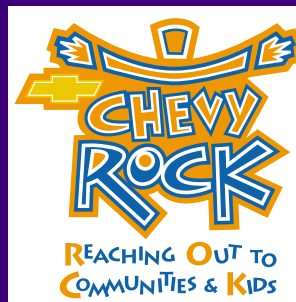

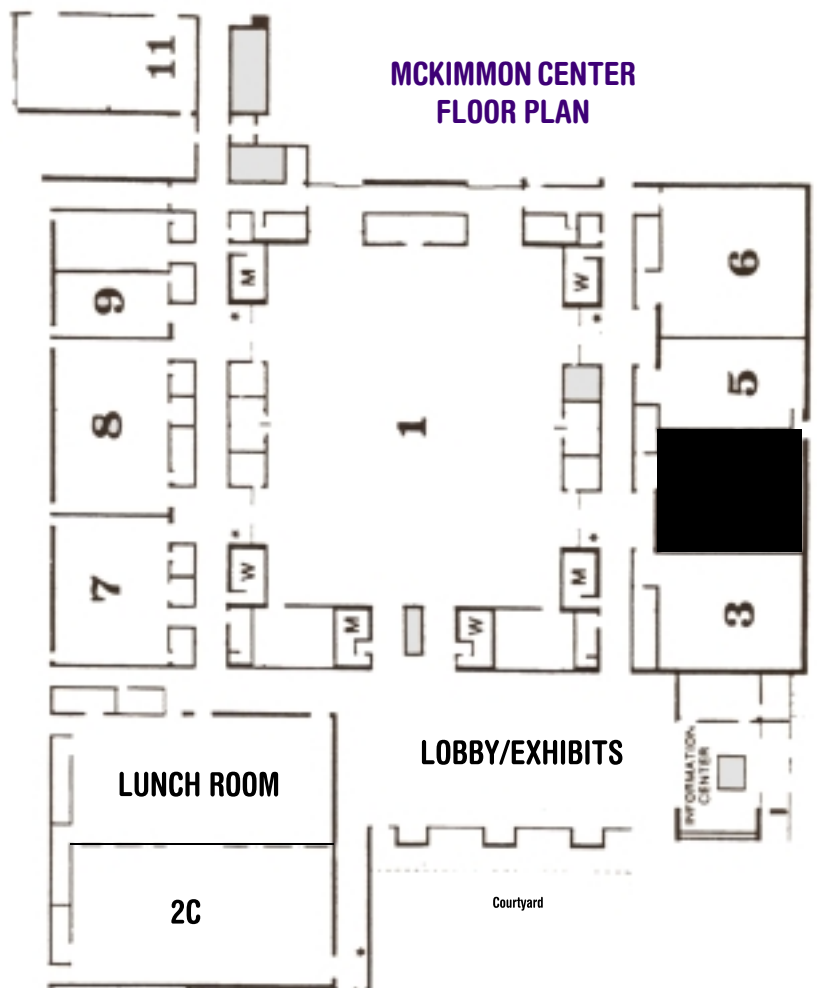
Room 9 He's a YABer, She's a YABer, You Can Be a YABer Too!

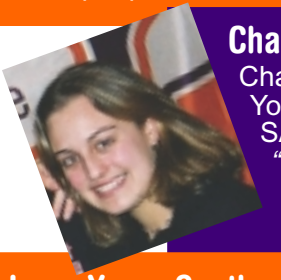
Caroline Ovia, Northeast Regional Representative
